D6 Receives **Property Tax Relief Grant**

This grant, awarded by the state of Illinois, allows eligible districts additional state funds in exchange for cutting a portion of their property taxes. According to the Illinois State Board of Education, a total of 233 districts applied for the grant.

DISTRICT 6 IS ONE OF FIVE LAKE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO BE AWARDED A 2020 PROPERTY TAX RELIEF GRANT.



All districts may apply for the grant yearly, pending appropriations. Eligible districts must have the highest tax rates within their organization type out of all districts that applied. Districts then have until March 30th to submit an abatement resolution to the county clerk, after which the ISBE will distribute the grant to each eligible district. After this process is complete, District 6 will receive about \$1,139,922.00 in grant funds which will allow a portion of property taxes to be cut.

Dr. Roberts Receives Award

Distinguished Support of Music Education

Zion Elementary School District 6
Superintendent, Dr. Keely Roberts,
was the 2020 recipient of the Save
The Music Foundation's 15th annual
Administrator Award for Distinguished
Support of Music Education. This
prestigious award was presented in
San Diego, California at the annual
National Conference on Education,
hosted by AASA, the School
Superintendents Association. This
award recognizes one superintendent or
school district CEO who has exhibited
outstanding commitment to restoring

music education in his or her school district. Dr. Roberts was chosen for her deep commitment to providing students in our district with a well-rounded education that includes music.

Under her leadership, our district has built pathways that have expanded musical programming opportunities district-wide. Her guiding principle, that District 6 children deserve what every child deserves, is evident within our band, orchestra, choir, and mariachi programs. Students are now able to experiment with many musical instruments, enroll in a variety of music classes that are outside of their core content, and are given opportunities to

showcase their talent and skill to the community through multiple concerts from ensembles with varying playing abilities (beginning band and orchestra, intermediate band and orchestra, middle school orchestra, concert band, elementary choir, combined choir, and mariachi). Additionally, students now have the opportunity to enroll in summer music camps for both band and orchestra.



Beginning in 2017, the first annual Fine Arts Festival, which included the Zion's Got Talent Show, was introduced. At this festival, all Zion community members are invited to enjoy the wonder of music, art, and talents of District 6 students. Such programmatic expansions have provided students with an increased exposure to a variety of musical opportunities that they may have otherwise not been afforded prior to Roberts' leadership.

Dr. Roberts praised the work of the Save the Music Foundation. "Save The Music Foundation has perhaps been most impactful in Zion District 6 in helping instill in our children the belief that they deserve the experiences and opportunities of music," she said. "It is through their generosity that we have been able to build our first ever orchestra and mariachi programs. The commitment to supporting our vision for building a world-class music department is so greatly appreciated."

The Save the Music Foundation has not only invested in District 6 schools through instrument donations, but has helped to provide all students in District 6 the opportunity to enroll in band, mariachi, or orchestra, while encouraging them to reach their full potential through the power of making music.

EAST ELEMENTARY SCHOOL RECOGNIZED AS IMAGINE LEARNING SCHOOL OF EXCELLENCE
